Teaching Strategies for Italian

The Department of Italian at Rutgers University offers three fully online professional development courses for teachers of Italian. These highly interactive and engaging courses equip teachers with dynamic and effective ways to introduce students to the richness of the Italian experience through current events, food, and culture. These topics allow teachers to prepare their students for the AP exam/college courses, while simultaneously earning professional development hours (4 hours per module).

- Online, so teachers will not be required to attend class sessions during specific time slots.
- Modules can be taken in any sequence.
- A certificate is awarded by the Department of Italian for completion of ALL 3 modules.

June: Teaching Italian through Food
