#### **Benvenuti! Welcome to Italian 101!**

### **Course objectives:**

101 aims to develop communicative proficiency of the target language and culture by cultivating the five skills of speaking, listening, reading, writing and cultural competency in the interpretive, interpersonal, and presentational modes. Upon successful completion of the course students should be able to:

- **COMPREHEND** the main ideas of both *spoken* and *written* language along with some supporting details from both edited and non-edited, highly contextualized and uncomplicated, oral situations and written texts that represent authentic situations.
- ❖ COMMUNICATE using learned words and phrases and simple sentences in both *oral* and *written* contexts. The student should be able to describe and narrate in the present by asking and answering simple questions and creating coherent sentences and short paragraphs to express personal meaning about a variety of topics.
- ❖ COMPARE similarities and differences with regard to products and practices of the target culture and their own, while demonstrating a cultural awareness and understanding when they communicate.

Did you buy your code at the online store?

If you created a student account on the store, use the same login information. If you can't see your course book on the home page after logging in, go to **Step 5 – Select a Course/Class**. If no book appears, go to **Step 3 – Activate Code**.

#### **Create an Account**

- In the "Login Information" section of the account creation page, enter a username of your choice;
- Enter the email address you would like to associate with your account;
- Enter and confirm a password of your choice;
- In the "Personal Profile" section, enter your first and last name as you wish them to appear in your Instructor's roster;
- Select the year of your birth from the drop down list;
- Enter a Student ID (optional);
- In the "Security Information" section, provide the answer to a secret question, which may later be used to help you access your account if you forget your password;
- After you enter all of the information, click on "Create an Account";
- Click on "Agree" (before your account is created, you must agree to the terms and conditions of use policy).

#### **Step 3 – Activate Code**

- On the code activation screen, enter your Supersite Code;
- Click "Activate Code" to continue;
- Look for a message at the top of the screen confirming that the code was successfully redeemed.

#### Step 4 – Select a School

- Locate your school by typing your school's name, "Rutgers University New Brunswick". To narrow the search results, include the city and state (or country, if outside of the USA) in which your school is located;
- Click "Find". If the terms you entered did not result in a successful search, follow the screen tips to revise your search;
- Select your school from the list by clicking the radio button next to the school name;
- Click "Select School" to add the school to your account;
- Look for a message at the top of the screen confirming you successfully added the school.
