NEW REQUIREMENTS starting in 2020

The **Major** in Italian is comprised of two sets of courses: the first is designed to provide students linguistic proficiency; the second offers students a solid foundation in Italian cultural production across the centuries—from Dante to opera, theater, and contemporary film.

Italian Minor

6 courses in Italian language and culture. Students must complete 01:560:132.

Remaining courses to be chosen from the Italian Studies Course List. Students must earn a minimum grade of C to count the course toward the Minor. The student's program must be approved by the Undergraduate Director.

NB: 1.5 Credit "Mini-Courses" do NOT count toward the Major/Minor

NB: 105/6 Italian for Reading Knowledge does NOT count toward the Major/Minor
